

Snake River Amateur Radio Club

Constitution

Article I - Name

The name of this club is (The) Snake River Amateur Radio Club herein after known as the club.

Article II - Purpose

Section A: Volunteer Examiner Coordinator Program

- 1. To Provide Federal Communication Commission testing for Amateur Radio licenses.**
- 2. To Provide a pool of accredited volunteer examiners for the VEC program.**

Section B: Emergency Communications

- 1. To provide communication in times of disaster or other emergencies at the city, county or state levels through the Amateur Radio Emergency Services (ARES) organization.**

Section C: Public Service

- 1. To provide communications for charitable, public or other community activities.**

Section D: Hobby

- 1. To provide a meeting place to socialize and to promote the exchange of ideas to further enhance the hobby of Amateur Radio.**

Article III - Incorporation/Non-profit

Section A: This club shall be a non-profit organization incorporated under the laws of the State of Idaho. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any private individual or be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets.

Section B: In the event of dissolution of the corporation, any assets of the corporation must be distributed to one or more

organizations exclusively for religious, charitable or educational purpose.

Section C: The executive board shall appoint a registered agent whose name and address shall be on file with the Idaho Secretary of State. The registered agent shall complete and file the annual reports as required by the State of Idaho.

Article IV - By Laws

Section A: The qualifications of members, the categories of membership, voting and other rights of members and membership fees shall be set forth in the By-Laws.

Section B: The number of directors, functions, term of office and the method of their election shall be set forth in the By-Laws.

Section C: All other details of the internal operation of the club shall be set forth in the By-Laws.

Article V - Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws

Section A: Constitution

1. The constitution may be amended by the following conditions.

a. All requests for changes or alterations of the constitution will be presented to the board of directors.

b. The board of directors shall draft the changes and submit it at the next regular meeting. All full members will be notified by mail, email, phone or in person of the impending vote. If approved by a two-thirds vote of the full members on the club roster, the change will be declared in effect and shall become part of the constitution. Absentee ballots will be accepted.

2. The By-Laws may be amended by the following conditions.

a. All requests for changes or alterations to the By-Laws will be presented by two full members and discussed by the membership at a regular scheduled meeting. A vote will be taken at the next regular scheduled meeting and if approved by two-thirds

majority vote of the full members present, the change shall be declared in effect and shall become part of the By-Laws.
